

An Alternate Route to Teacher Licensure

After several years of substituting, James had achieved his state teaching license early in 2018 by completing Nevada's Alternative Route to Licensure (ARL) process. Recommended to him by his teaching mentor, the late Thomas N. Pappas, Ph.D., the ARL program requires a candidate who already possesses a bachelor's degree to, within three years, 1) successfully serve as a long-term substitute, and 2) receive at least two positive observations from qualified education professionals.
